

At first glance, Fiorella Ynes Chávez Iturre is a fun, cheerful girl with a big smile and special charisma. She was born in Lima, Peru, where her love for dance and the cultural legacy of her family began.

Fiorella is a professional makeup artist. She has also studied manicure and acrylic nails.

However, her most important career is being a dancer. "My job in Peru was to dance," she says. I've had complete artistic training; including ballet. contemporary My whole family dances. It's in our blood.

When I was four years old, my parents introduced my brother and me to the world of Marinera Norteña. It all started as a hobby, but then we really fell in love with the dance, and its art."

A year and a half ago she came to New Jersey to learn English at Uceda Institute.

She had been studying for a year at Uceda Paterson before signing up with her brother, Juan Antony, for Uceda's Got Talent where they performed a Marinera Norteña.

"I used to tell my classmates that I was a dancer, but many didn't believe me.

> They thought that I was just another dancing girl. But the truth is that I am a professional dancer. When the registrations for Uceda's Got Talent opened, they encouraged me to sign up. I told my brother, and we auditioned," recalls Fiorella.

"I owe my passion for this dance to my family. I have videos and photos where my parents are dancing the whole time. They even got married dressed as Marinera dancers.

My uncles and their wives dance - everyone in my family dances! So that when my brother and I danced at the show, my whole family was dancing, too." Fiorella says that her family is her biggest inspiration for the dance.

The Marinera Norteña is, without a doubt, one of the most representative cultural manifestations of Peru. It is the product of a mixture of Spanish Fandango, African Zamacueca, and indigenous dances characterized by the agile rhythms between two dancers representing a conversation of love. It is a dance that expresses art and national identity based on elegance, strength, playfulness, and gallantry.

Dressed in the typical outfit of this dance, Fiorella highlighted her talent on stage waving a white handkerchief in her hand. Dancing with her partner, she performed tapping steps, and wide harmonious movements with her silk, white skirt. Maintaining an elegant posture throughout the whole dance, her fluid movements demonstrating excellent coordination and choreography, Fiorella put on her best show.

She expressed that being an artist implies many things, so the body, the mind, and the emotions must be worked on. "I honestly have great regard for myself as an artist. Thank God that my brother and I have always had the support of our parents. They have always encouraged us to continue growing beyond the dance. I have also done acting and singing, and everything else that could complement us, and inspire us to continue growing as artists".

Fiorella describes with genuine exhilaration how dance makes her feel. When she dances, musical notes seem to flow through her veins. She seems to poses a rhythm impregnated with the artistic legacy of her family. "When I dance, I feel my energy. I feel the energy of space. I connect my chakras and I can feel the energy of my body dancing. It is something very beautiful. Being on stage of Uceda's Got Talent, I realized that I feel much more comfortable dancing in the spotlight than dancing among people - at a party or something."

At 25. Fiorella has set for herself a very clear goal in the United States. She wants to become fully bilingual. "My dream is to dance. I danced for seven wonderful years in Peru. Those were the most beautiful years of my life. And it's something that I would like to live again. Currently, I am looking into how I can continue doing it from here, but my shortterm goal is to completely master the English language. I want to feel safe and confident speaking it fluently, so that I can continue fulfilling my other objectives."

This talented young woman captured the audience and the judges at Uceda's Got Talent; winning first place and \$ 2,000. "I decided to spend that money with my family, and enjoy it one hundred percent. Because it is not easy to leave your country and show the rest of the world what you are; demonstrate with art and dance how culturally beautiful my country is. I am proud to represent it with pride and better still, I am proud to honor the legacy of my family".

After her success at Uceda's Got Talent, Fiorella is ready to encourage other students to participate, and show their talents. "Take a chance. You lose nothing," she says. "It's a little nerve-wracking, but you lose nothing by trying. If you go to the finals, it will be a new experience for you. I advise you to take advantage of the opportunity, it could be a unique experience in your life. I made a lot of new friends at the show. So, enjoy it!

The Versatile Voice Of A Music Lover. His Dynamic Voice And His Ability To Interpret Any Genre Of Music Led Him To Second Place At Uceda's Got Talent 2022.

Rafael José Casadiegos was born in Barranquilla, Colombia; a city on the Caribbean coast where Shakira, Sofía Vergara, and former baseball player Edgar Rentería are also from. At 37 years old, he began to study English at Uceda Institute in Paterson, New Jersey. This father of one is an industrial engineer, but his real vocation is singing.

Rafael's desire to sing began when he was 12 years old. However, it was in high school watching friends sing and play the guitar, that he really felt drawn to music. Later, when he entered university, a classmate heard him sing and suggested that he audition for the school's orchestra. "I did, and I performed Carlos Vives' 'La Cartera'. I was chosen, and remained singer of the orchestra throughout my entire college career.

I began to perform on many different stages, and it was something that truly began to enrich my life as a singer. I am very grateful to the director of the orchestra, Julio Garavito, because he believed in me more than I believed in myself in those days."

Most of Rafael's musical training comes from all his years of singing on stage. This, in spite of being an industrial engineer. "In Barranquilla, I was always singing in different places and in musical groups," he says. When I graduated from high school, I wanted to study music, but my dad didn't like the idea and I ended up studying industrial engineering."

"As a music lover, I have been listening to music all my life. I love all kinds of rhythms and genres. I listen to everything from rock to cumbia, champeta, llanera music, rancheras, and everything else. As a kid, I looked up to young salsa singers like Salserin, Servando, and Florentino. I used to dream that I could be like them. They awoke in me the desire to be a singer. As the years went by, I learned to put aside my fears and any mental barriers, and decided to give my singing all my best; even if others sang better than me", affirms Casadiego.

Rafael José claims to be a versatile singer - able to sing in various rhythms regardless of cultural origin. He says that he believes in love, and in offering his very best to everyone he meets. He believes in the power of music and the balance that it brings to everyone's life. "I have always thought of music as the axis of my life," he says. It is the place for the desires of my heart. Music means tranquility, inspiration, enjoyment, and happiness to me. Music has always been there for me. It has always been part of my life. In my work as an industrial engineer, I get stressed. But in my work as a singer, I de-stress. It is amusing to me that I get paid for doing something that I love to do."

After living the U.S. for about a year and a half, Rafael found in Uceda's Got Talent the perfect opportunity to share his talent with others.

In addition, his participation served him as a way to break the ice at school and the people he has gotten to know there. He said, "I chose to perform three songs because I wanted to show the versatility of my talent and my voice. It is difficult to sing three different rhythms at accelerated tempos, and from three different cultures. I sang Tito Rojas' Puerto Rican salsa, 'Señora de Madrugada'; the popular Colombian song 'Aventurero' by Yeison Jimenez'; and the Spanish Rock 'Lamento Boliviano' by the Argentinian group Enanitos Verdes."

However, Uceda's Got Talent was not Rafael's first appearance in the United States. In 2019, when he first came to the U.S., he participated in a singing contest in Queens, New York. "A friend invited me to the event," he recalls. "When we arrived, he told everyone that he was my representative. One thing led to another, and next thing you know they're asking me if I would like to sing. It turns out that one of the finalists was not going to make it, and they needed to fill his spot. I jumped at the opportunity and said, yes. I sang, and I won."

At Uceda's Got Talent final show, the reaction of the audience was evident during Rafael's presentation. He is sure that that was a plus with the judges, and that it helped him win second place. "Their reaction was excellent. They were connected with every part of my performance. I love singing like this - to feel the people connected to what I'm doing on stage."



As for his \$1,000 prize, Rafael decided to invest it in sound equipment. He says that he gained more than that from the experience and the opportunity to showcase his talent. "That money came from music, so I give it back to music." Of the contest he had this to say: "If you have a musical talent that you would like to demonstrate, sign up for Uceda's Got talent. It's worth the effort and the experience, even if you don't win. Taking that bold step to perform before an audience makes you win. The prize doesn't matter. By participating, you may be breaking a paradigm that could help you improve, and take your life to another level."



"I'm not just a musician. I'm an artist": Brian Castro Uceda's Got Talent 2022 Third Place Winner

According to Brian Castro Rangel, he discovered his talent and good ear for music when he was a boy in his native Colombia. He worked at his parents record store where he would play LP's and cassettes for customers. Listening to all that music, he felt that he could hear and identify the instruments in each song. "It was a magical world for me," he says. "When I finished school, I enrolled at the ASAB (Academia Superior de Artes de Bogotá) where I studied guitar and composition."

Additionally, Brian has studied photography and video editing. He has specialized in music, audiovisual production, editing, and 2D animation for many years. Two months ago, he began his studies of English at Uceda through its virtual program EnglishLine, which led him to sign up with his band, DeRaiz, winning third place at Uceda's Got Talent 2022.

"I thought it was wonderful to be able to show my musical talent at the school where I am studying. I saw that it was a great opportunity for me and my friends. I am very happy with everything that has happened to me at Uceda. It has been very good to learn English because I need it for my music, my connections, and my life", he affirms.

Brian had previously entered and won other contests in the United States. In Los Angeles, he participated with the group "Son Batá" on a reality TV show where Jennifer Lopez, Marc Anthony, and Jaime King appeared as judges. He has also participated in the production of songs, soundtrack and sound effects for several television programs in Colombia such as the Netflix series 'Rosario Tijeras', and the soap opera 'La Reina del Flow.

"I define myself as an artist. I am an artist because I understand the art of music, photography, video, graphic illustration, and dance. I love to dance. I have also done oil painting. So, I can't say I'm just a musician. I'm an artist, a creative director," he adds.

Brian feels that music allows people to connect regardless of language or culture. "Music transmits emotions and breaks down barriers. Music means a lot to me. At the age of 13, I picked up my guitar and ever since then, music has opened doors for me wherever I go. I have traveled a lot, and I have found myself through my music. It is something spiritual for me. I ask God to allow my music to heal people who are lonely or anxious. Music is a very powerful thing that allows us to heal and transform."

Brian's musical career has been inspired by his parents whom he thanks for all the support he's had. "My father was a composer from a very young age. My mother is a very special person whose life has always been filled with music. My parents are the ones who have supported me, and have shown me a path through education, sacrifices and respect. I sing for God, for myself, for my parents and for the world. I want to bring joy to people through my music. All I ask of God is to allow me to reach big audiences, and help me inspire future generations."

At Uceda's Got Talent, Brian's band opened the second part of the show with their own composition titled, 'Conexion'.

"We wanted to represent the Latin American beat. We wanted to transmit our joy to the audience. We wanted to highlight our folklore with this salsa fusion composition," explains Brian.

"The judges were very fair, and I think they made a good decision. We are very grateful to Uceda. Uceda's Got Talent must continue to be promoted year after year because while this time it was an opportunity for me, tomorrow it will be an opportunity for someone else. And I am sure that many of the those who get the opportunity to shine on this stage will become great artists in the world. It's not about the prize; It's about making our dreams come true. Participating at Uceda's Got Talent and giving our best performance was spectacular. My bandmates and I really enjoyed it. Coming in third place was a great reward and an encouragement to continue working in our music," he stated. They've decided to invest the \$500 they won in the production of their next album and a music video.





The voice of Ukraine at Uceda's Got Talent 2022

Angelina Herasymenko was born in 2000 in the Ukraine. At 22 years of age, she could have never imagined living through the cruelty of a war that would become one the hardest experiences of her life. Leaving her family and friends, and traveling to the safety of America has been one of the most difficult things she has ever done. Despite all the things she's had to endure, Angelina is able to use music as a refuge, overcome the pains of her ordeal, and move on with her life.

"When the war started in Ukraine, my world came crashing down. It was only thanks to music that I was able to find the strength to get up and move on," she

Angelina has been studying English at Uceda Institute for two months. When she learned about Uceda's Got Talent, she decided to enter as a singer.

She started singing when she was a little girl. She went to music school for 8 years, and studied to be a choir director for 4 years. She then began her studies at the Musical University of Ukraine, eventually completing 6 years of specialization in solo singing.

"To be honest, I can't imagine what life would be like without music", she says. Music is a very important part of my life. Music is my oxygen; my support. I have a deep, velvety voice. From a very young age, I sang on Ukrainian stages; participated in various competitions and won prizes. I have never given up. My teachers and my friends have always encouraged, but my parents have been my biggest fans. Now, I would like to continue with my career, but, here, in the United States", says Angelina.



At the auditions, she performed a Ukrainian song called "Oy verche" qualifying her for the finals at Uceda's Got Talent. "When I found out that I was a finalist, I felt extremely happy," she said. "I began to prepare a new song and my outfit for that night. This was my first competition in the United States and I was very excited and nervous."

The night of the grand finale, Angelina won fourth place and a cash prize of \$250 with the song "Amado Mio". "It's a song about passion and love. And it's a song in which I could identify the feelings that the songwriter was trying to convey," she said. "I was so surprised to see the reaction of the audience. Thais studied six months at Uceda Institute in Passaic, New Jersey, improving her English, in preparation for nursing school. Thais, performed her "Heart on Stage" at Uceda's Got Talent tying in fourth place with Angelina Herasymenko.

In October 2021, Thais came to the U.S. to study English for a month. Of this, she says, "My cousin had studied at Uceda and convinced me to register there. Then, I went back to my country to get my F1 visa. My initial plan was to study at a college, but since my DSO didn't have an advanced level of English, the only alternative I had was to go to an English institute. That is how in February 2022, I returned to study at Uceda."

She trained as a dancer at the Ecuadorian Chamber Ballet and the Metrodanza College of Arts. However, Thais assures, her mother was the one who really introduced her to dance. "My mom discovered my talent for dancing when I was 6 years old. She saw that I could develop as a dancer."

"Dancing connects my soul to the rhythm of the music and allows me to let off steam. For me, dancing is freedom. I dance not thinking about judgement. I don't worry whether I'm dancing right or wrong. For me, dancing is life," says Thais.



"What motivated me to participate was my family and friends who, in spite of the distance, continue to support me," she says. "They are my number one fans. I had been away for about a year, and I needed to get back on stage and prove to myself that I can only solve my fears by facing them."

Regarding her preparation for the final event, she says that it was a process of great dedication. "There were very stressful days when I couldn't come up with anything. It was very difficult for me to choose the music, the choreography, the costumes and the hairstyle.



But thanks to the support of my friends, everything came out all right in the end. I decided to dance hiphop, reggaeton, and ballroom. I wanted my performance to be captivating, and be able to hold on to the audience the whole time, and I think I succeeded. Thais plans to use her \$250 prize toward her nursing studies. "I have a lot of expenses for school," she says. "I have to buy books and other supplies." Winning fourth place in the U.S. adds another accomplishment to her artistic career. "It is something I can put in my resume," she declares.
